Prof. Zulfiqarali G. Abbas

Prof. Zulfiqarali G. Abbas is a distinguished consultant physician, endocrinologist, and diabetologist based in Dar es Salaam, Tanzania. With a medical career spanning over three decades, Prof. Abbas has dedicated his expertise to the field of diabetes-related foot complications since 1992. His exceptional contributions have been recognized through prestigious honours from the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Glasgow and the Royal College of Physicians of London.

Currently, Prof. Abbas holds several key positions in the global medical community. He is the President of D-Foot International, Chair of the Pan-African Diabetic Foot Study Group, and an Executive Board Member of the International Working Group on the Diabetic Foot (IWGDF). He also serves as the Vice-President of the Association of International Medical Salvage of the Extremity and the Chairman of the National Diabetic Foot Guidelines for Specialist Care in Tanzania.

In academia, Prof. Abbas is a Visiting Professor at Staffordshire University, UK, and a faculty member for the Master in Diabetes Mellitus Education (MSc DME) program at the Centre of Diabetes Studies, University of Abuja, Nigeria. His scholarly work includes membership on the editorial boards of several international peer-reviewed journals and extensive publications on the epidemiology of diabetes-related foot complications. Prof. Abbas has authored and edited numerous book chapters and a comprehensive book on diabetes-related foot complications for healthcare workers.

Prof. Abbas's commitment to improving diabetic foot care led him to establish the Step-by-Step Foot Project in 2003 in Dar es Salaam, Tanzania. This pioneering project has since been implemented in 120 countries, providing vital support and education to healthcare professionals worldwide. His significant achievements have been recognized with multiple awards, including the Karel Bakker Diabetic Foot Medal of Honour from the IWGDF in 2019, a Life Achievement Award from the World Union of Wound Healing Societies in 2022, and an award of honors from the Diabetic Foot Society of India in October 2022. In January 2023, he received a recognition award for outstanding achievement and services in the field of humanity in Tanzania.

Prof. Abbas continues to be a leading figure in the field of endocrinology and diabetology, making substantial contributions to medical research, education, and patient care on a global scale.

Esteemed Guest Speaker

Prof. Dato. Dr. Harikrishna K.R. Nair



Prof. Dato. Dr. Harikrishna K.R. Nair is a distinguished leading figure in the field of wound care. Currently serving as the Director of Kuala Lumpur Hospital in Malaysia, the largest hospital in South East Asia with more than 2300 beds, Prof. Nair's extensive contributions to medical science and education are widely recognized.

Prof. Nair holds the esteemed position of President-Elect of D-Foot International and is the current President of the World Union of Wound Healing Societies. His leadership roles extend to being the President-Elect of the Asian Wound Care Association, Chair of the Commonwealth Wound Care Resources Alliance, and Chair of the ASEAN Wound Council. He is also the Past President of the Asia Pacific Association for Diabetic Limb Problems and a Director of the ISTAP. His board memberships include the International Wound Infection Institute and many other notable organizations.

In academia, Prof. Nair is a Professor at the Faculty of Medicine, Lincoln University, Perdana University Board of Studies, International Islamic University, and the Institute of Health Management in Austria, among others. He is a member of the Academy of Professors Malaysia and has been instrumental in advancing medical education and research.

A prolific researcher and writer, Prof. Nair is the Editor-in-Chief of the Wounds APAC Journal, JWC Silk Road Supplement, and the Malaysian Journal of Medical Research. He also serves on the board of the International Wound Journal and the International Journal of Lower Extremities Wound. His scholarly work includes authoring 21 books, 15 book chapters, and over 100 peer-reviewed journal articles.

Prof. Nair's exceptional contributions to public health have earned him numerous accolades, including the WHO Dr. Lee Jon Wok public health award and the Normal Gill Award. His commitment to advancing wound care and diabetic limb care has made a profound impact globally.





Prof. Frances L. Game

Prof. Frances L. Game is a highly esteemed Diabetologist who has been serving at the University Hospitals of Derby and Burton NHS Foundation Trust, UK, since 2011. She holds the positions of Clinical Director of Research and Development and the Derby Clinical Trials Support Unit, and she is an Honorary Professor at the University of Nottingham.

Prof. Game is the current Chair of the International Working Group on the Diabetic Foot (IWGDF) since January 2024, overseeing international consensus guidelines. She has chaired both the Classification and Wound Healing subgroups of the IWGDF for the 2023 guidelines. She is also the Europe Regional Advisor for D-Foot International. Her primary clinical and research focus is the Diabetic Foot, with over 130 published papers and book chapters on the subject. She actively leads several multi-center and multinational trials in this field, with a keen interest in service development to manage diabetic foot disease in a more cost-effective and patient-centered manner.

As an educator, Prof. Game is actively involved in teaching locally, nationally, and internationally, frequently lecturing at major diabetes conferences. She has collaborated with Diabetes UK on their Putting Feet First campaign and serves as the Clinical Lead for the National Diabetes Foot Audit of England and Wales. Since May 2018, she has also been one of the NHS England Co-Clinical Directors for Diabetes in the Midlands, UK.

Prof. Game's contributions have been widely recognized, earning her the Edward James Olmos Award for Amputation Prevention by the American Limb Preservation Society in 2021. Additionally, she received the Roger Pecoraro Award for outstanding scientific achievement in the prevention, treatment, and management of diabetes-related foot complications at the 84th Scientific Sessions of the American Diabetes Association held in Orlando, FL, in June 2024.

Esteemed Guest Speaker

Prof. Zahid Miyan



Dr. Zahid Miyan is a distinguished Internal Medicine Specialist and Diabetologist. He is the Head of the Department of Diabetic Foot Care at the Baqai Institute of Diabetology and Endocrinology, Baqai Medical University, Karachi, Pakistan.

Dr. Miyan plays a pivotal role in the diabetic foot care community as the Chairman and Council Member of the MENA Region for D-Foot International. He is also the President of the Primary Care Diabetes Association Pakistan (PCDA) and serves as the Project Director for the "Saving Limbs in Pakistan (SLiP) - The Fast-Track Pathway Implementation in Pakistan" and the "Footwear for Every Diabetic (FED)" projects. His past leadership roles include serving as the Vice President of D-Foot International and as the President of the National Association of Diabetes Educators of Pakistan.

In addition to his extensive administrative and clinical work, Dr. Miyan is the Program Director for the Diabetic Foot Training Program for healthcare professionals and a member of the FLIRT Project under D-Foot International. He also serves as the General Secretary of the Pakistan Working Group on Diabetic Foot (PWGDF).

Dr. Miyan's contributions to diabetic foot care and his dedication to advancing treatment and prevention strategies make him a leading figure in his field, both nationally and internationally.





Dr. Faraja Simon Chiwanga

Dr. Faraja Simon Chiwanga is an Internal Medicine Physician and Clinical Endocrinologist, currently serving as the Assistant Director of Medical Services at Muhimbili National Hospital – Mloganzila. She holds an impressive array of academic qualifications, including a Master of Medicine in Internal Medicine, a Master of Science in Endocrinology and Diabetes, and a Master of Science in Public Health.

Dr. Chiwanga is an honorary lecturer at Muhimbili University of Health and Allied Sciences, a senior researcher at Oxford University, and a Doctoral researcher at Uppsala University. She is actively involved as a consultant in a National Diabetes Foot Program, where she provides mentorship and training to lower-tier hospitals to prevent diabetic foot complications.

Her expertise has been recognized globally, as evidenced by her participation in the WHO expert consultation group for establishing global diabetes targets for 2030. Dr. Chiwanga's research focuses on the clinical and epidemiological aspects of non-communicable diseases, particularly diabetes, hypertension, cancer, and thyroid disorders. Additionally, she is passionate about climate change and health, working to understand the health effects of extreme heat on vulnerable populations such as diabetes patients.

With over 20 articles published in peer-reviewed journals, Dr. Chiwanga is an active contributor to the academic community. She also serves as a reviewer for various national and international journals and is a member of the UK Research and Innovation International Development Peer Review College.

Dr. Chiwanga's dedication to improving healthcare and her significant contributions to research and education make her a prominent figure in the field of internal medicine and endocrinology.
